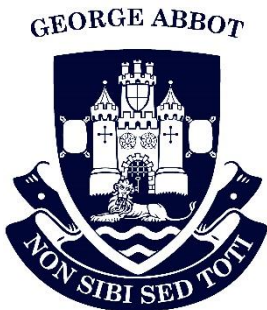

Safeguarding

George Abbot School takes the safeguarding and wellbeing of all students very seriously. If you have any concerns about yourself or someone else at school, you can do a number of things to help:

Learn to work both independently and with others

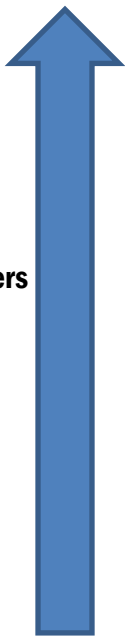
Self and peer assess your work

School Code of Conduct:

We have high standards and expectations at George Abbot School and insist that everyone is treated with respect and courtesy. Students should know, understand and follow the Community Charter and take the time to read the school rules which can be found on the Student Hub.

It is of upmost importance that students understand that instructions given by teachers must be followed at the first time of asking.

Everyone has the right to speak to a member of staff about a decision made but this must be done at the right time, in the right place and in the right way.

(a) at the right time... end of the lesson, break, after school

(b) in the right place... in private and not in front of other students

(c) in the right way... in a sensible and courteous manner

As well as abiding by the Community Charter it is important that students are the following:

Ready: Students start each day fully ready to learn. This means having the right equipment, books and homework for the day. Students have the correct uniform and approach lessons with a positive attitude.

Respectful: Students are respectful to their peers and members of staff both during lessons and free time.

Safe: Students will behave in a way that keeps themselves and others safe. Students should stay in bounds and in their assigned areas of the school.

A full copy of the school rules can be found on the Student Hub. Please ensure these are read at the start of term.

Uniform

Students must be dressed appropriately for school and full school uniform must always be worn. This includes:

- Smart black school shoes
- Black school trousers or school skirt (girls)
- White shirt with top button done up
- School tie
- School blazer
- School jumper (optional)

The following are not allowed to be seen at school:

- Extreme hairstyles
- Jewellery (one stud per ear allowed)
- Trainers (including all black)
- Hoodies
- Non-school branded sweatshirts/jumpers
- Fake nails or obvious nail varnish
- Rolled up skirts
- Heavy make up

The school will have the final say on what is appropriate for school. If a student is unsure if something is appropriate for school they must speak to their form tutor or head of year prior to bringing / wearing it to school.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones are to be switched off and not seen or heard whilst on school premises. Students will be reminded of this at the school gates every day. If a phone is seen or heard (including break and lunchtimes) it will be confiscated by a member of staff.

If a student needs to contact a parent urgently they must speak to their head of year.

If a parent needs to contact a student during the school day they must do so via the school office.

Students may use any of the school computers to check SMHW.

Students must not be seen with headphones as this would indicate the use of a mobile phone.

Teachers will not ask or request students to use their phones in lessons.

Teachers have been told not allow students to use their phones under any circumstances during a lesson, including listening to music.

Attendance

All students should aim for 100% attendance each term. If a student is too unwell to attend school a parent or guardian must call the absence line each day of the illness. If a student is off school for four or more days, they will be seen by the attendance officer which will provide support required to catch up work.

Lateness

Students should be through the school gate by 8.25am at the latest to enable enough time to arrive at their tutor room. Members of staff will be present on the school gates and any students arriving after 8.30am will be issued with a detention at lunchtime. Students who miss tutor time completely will be issued with an after-school detention.

Homework

All homework will be set on Show My Homework with an assigned deadline. Homework must be submitted on time. Any problems with homework must be addressed before the day of submission.

Detentions

Detentions are issued at the discretion of the teacher or member of the pastoral team. Detentions can be set for lunch time, either with the classroom teacher or with Heads of Faculty or after school. 24 hours' notice will be given to parents for any after school detention issued.
