## Headteacher's Message

This will be the last official bulletin of this term. I am not sure any of us will be 100% coherent by this time next week. Today, I would like to say some official thank yous before I move on to some final reminders for the term.

- Thank you to all of you reading for trusting us and our risk management plans this term – you have supported your children in helping them to feel comfortable at school and encouraged them to embrace every day.
- Thank you to our students for their consideration for others – both fellow students and staff. It has felt as if we have all worked together with real determination to follow our guidelines and actively keep each other safe.
- Thank you to our staff who have been stoic in getting on with working in new ways, teaching in multiple different spaces around a very large site and supporting their colleagues and our students, emotionally, socially, educationally.
- Thank you to our governors who have provided vital challenge and wise counsel as we have entered unknown lands.
- Particular thanks to our premises team. Keeping the site safe, providing PPE resources, organising enhanced site cleaning routines, daily fogging, managing the holy grail combination of heat and fresh air, dealing with boiler replacements. Thank you Nigel, Sam, Ash, Sally and Sarah.

There are two more important thank yous and in these cases, goodbyes. Firstly, Mr Quinn. Mr Quinn has been a DT teacher at George Abbot for 37 years. He has taught many of our parents and many of your children. He has built brilliant props for musicals and plays, inspired a love of ingenious design, provided technical skill to numerous young engineers, rescued mission critical coursework projects at moments of imminent collapse, been a wonderful team player and all round George Abbot hero. Mr Quinn is going to embrace retirement from 2021 – much deserved after a career he should view with immense satisfaction.

The second thank you and goodbye is to Vivienne Johnson. Vivienne has been a governor at George Abbot for 30 years. Throughout much of that time, she was Chair of Governors. Vivienne has offered service to our school that is unmatched; her passion for education, her determination to ensure that every child in our community is able to access a rich and varied school experience, her support for our school, our staff and our families has been extraordinary. To mark this important occasion, I asked Mr Moloney, ex Headteacher of George Abbot to say a few words:

*"A rumour has reached me that Vivienne Johnson is about to retire as a governor at the school at the end of this term. If this is true, and I find it hard to imagine such a thing, George Abbot School will lose its most supportive, effective and influential governor of the past 30 years.*

*In the 15 years that I worked with Vivienne she displayed all the skills required of an outstanding Chair of Governors. Her prime focus was, firstly, on improving, in any way she could, the educational opportunities of the students and, secondly, on improving the working conditions for staff. She knew the school buildings well, she made sure that she knew what the key issues were for students and their parent). Her understanding of educational achievements and standards across the school was second to none and she led the governing body with confidence.*

*Schools were operating in a very different context some twenty years ago. Tony Blair and his New Labour government were waxing lyrical about "Education, Education, Education." There was considerable investment in schools and a range of exciting opportunities became available. Vivienne was always determined to ensure that George Abbot, as a leading school, remained at the forefront of educational development.*

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*Every opportunity that presented itself was carefully and critically assessed. If it could be demonstrated that a particular initiative would benefit students, staff or the local community then Vivienne would be content to accept it. Governors were being encouraged to take more responsibility for their buildings, their curriculum and their budgets. There was never a more important time for a school to have a passionate and committed governing body with a skilled and knowledgeable Chair at the helm. Vivienne was that person.*

*She was involved in the building of The Sports Centre in partnership with Surrey County Cricket and the Sixth Form Centre and the new outdoor sports pitch. During Vivienne's time at George Abbot the school became a Teaching School and a Centre of Initial Teacher Training.  
Major achievements all.*

*On top of everything else Vivienne was a pleasure to work with. I appreciated her openness, her sharp mind, her sense of humour and, more than anything, her passion and drive to get the best for the George Abbot community.*

*If the rumours are true and Vivienne does retire from the governing body at the end of this term she can depart with pride, comfortable in the knowledge that she has made a truly remarkable impact on George Abbot School over time."*

Words well said – thank you, Vivienne, on behalf of us all.


#### **Specific timings for Year 11 on Friday 18 December are as follows:**



The rate is calculated daily by Surrey County Council Public Health data intelligence team using the ONS 2019 mid-year population estimates. The 7-day average line on the chart is calculated using the average of cases for three days before, the date itself and the three days after any specific date. The average is not calculated for the most recent three dates as there is not enough data. 
