## Headteacher's Message

05 March 2021

All

Thank you so much for your attention to the various messages that have been flying home this week and we are sorry that they have been rather more frequent than usual. I do hope that they have left you with a reasonable understanding of how the return to school will work for our students. Our testing facilities are ready and, thanks to the fantastic community response, we have a team of testing staff scheduled and trained. We are trying not to think about the scale of the task – student by student, it will be achieved!

It is important that I remind parents of some of the key messages in our joint efforts to keep our community coronavirus-free. Firstly, a reminder that the 3 main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- A new continuous cough.
- A high temperature.
- A loss of or change in normal sense of taste or smell.

Anybody who displays one or more of these symptoms must self-isolate immediately and book a test for symptomatic illness through the NHS Test and Trace website. Home or school lateral flow testing can only be used if there are no symptoms – essentially, as a checking system for asymptomatic cases. Therefore, if your child is unwell with any of the above symptoms, please do NOT send them into school. It is also important to know that if someone has tested **positive** for COVID-19 in the last **90 days** they are **not** required to take a lateral flow test. **Please let us know if your child is in this category before they return to school.** We will let parents/carers know their child's lateral flow test results by email on all 3 occasions – if the test is positive, students will be isolated immediately and we will contact you by phone to arrange their safe return home.

The most important procedures in place to keep students safe, until Easter in the first instance, are:

- Lateral flow testing 3 times on return to school.
- Twice weekly lateral flow testing at home thereafter.
- Masks in lessons (except PE and Dance).
- Hand sanitising on entry and exit from every lesson.
- Maintaining a 2m distance from others when not in classrooms.
- Leaving the buildings in an orderly manner with a teacher after every lesson.
- Being dismissed from playgrounds gradually at the end of break.
- Year group lessons being zoned in areas of the school.
- Year 7 and 8 remaining in base classrooms for most lessons.
- Accessing canteen facilities in year group bubbles only.
- Additional daily cleaning across the school with an enhanced focus on touch points – eg door handles, handrails.
- Frequent cleaning of toilets and sinks throughout the school day.
- Year group designated toilet facilities.
- Wiping down of work areas between lessons.
- Not sharing stationery.
- Cleaning equipment thoroughly.
- Avoiding physical contact at all times.
- Not being in corridors unless travelling outside or inside at the beginning or end of break.
- Remaining on year group specific playgrounds.
- Keeping classroom windows and doors open and ensuring good ventilation.

Health advice indicates that masks should not be worn if they become damp, therefore, please do send your child back to school with TWO FACE MASKS and a sealable bag for hygienic storage. A reminder too, that food allowances may need topping up and pencil cases and wardrobes might have mysteriously emptied themselves over recent months, so a quick stationery and uniform check could prove essential this weekend.

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As we prepare to welcome our students back to school, we know how important it is to ensure that every one of our children feels connected and a strong sense of belonging at George Abbot. Resilience is underpinned by both of these things and positive relationships are key to our ability to cope and thrive. This will be at the forefront of our approach over the coming weeks.

Up until Easter, we will not be setting homework unless it is essential. Year 11 and Year 13 will however, be well occupied with revision – we will also be offering revision classes throughout the Easter holiday – details to follow next week. Students studying practical GCSEs should expect to be working on their portfolio and project work in the weeks ahead. We are taking this approach to homework because we are confident that George Abbot students are not in the position of having ‘lost’ learning during this academic year. It is our task to transition our students back to learning at school instead of learning at home. We will be working on ways to improve student recall and activate their memories. We will be checking in on their understanding through low stress activities to make sure that we ensure every child has secure foundations for the next step in their learning this year. Indeed, we will be actively avoiding words such as catch-up and lost.

We want our students to renew their personal goals, feel hopeful and positive about the future and to find time to smile and laugh with their friends. We want them to get back into extra-curricular activities and find enjoyment, exercise and enrichment through the opportunities that a life out of lockdown presents.

We hope that you too will support us in promoting this approach as we unfold our collective wings.

## Return to School: Testing Times Email

On Wednesday afternoon, we sent out details of your child’s testing slots for next week, to the prime contact email address. If you have not received this email, please check your junk folder. We understand there have been some issues viewing this email from mobile devices, especially Apple products. If this is the case, please see the email text below:

“From this Friday 5 March, we will begin to test students prior to their return to school next week.

This testing programme will consist of 3 staggered tests, each 3-5 days apart, taken on site in Gym 1, before switching to testing at home twice weekly after that. This email explains the process for the 3 staggered tests taken at school. Further detail about home testing will be shared next week.

The tests are Lateral Flow Rapid Tests, which involve self-swabbing of the throat and nose. Please click the following link for instructions: <https://www.georgeabbot.surrey.sch.uk/coronavirus/>. The test will be processed on site and results will be known within half an hour.

On the day of your child’s first test:


- Students must bring books, pens and equipment etc. for lessons that day.
- Students must ONLY arrive at the time indicated above.
- Students must enter via Elmslie gate. From here they will be directed to Gym 2.
- In Gym 2, students will be handed a registration card. They must keep this card with them until after their test.

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- From Gym 2 students will be directed to Gym 1 where the test will take place.
- After the test, students will exit via the back of Gym 1.
- Students will wait on the Year 7 playground for half an hour for the test result to be recorded. In the event of bad weather, they will wait in Elmslie Hall.
- If their test comes back negative, students are to go to the usual classroom indicated on their timetable for that lesson.
- If the test comes back positive, students will be sent to EM1 where they will wait to be sent home.
- You will be notified of your child's test on this email.

For their second and third test, student's will be sent to the gym at their allotted time by their classroom teacher. It is really important students attend all 3 testing appointments.

Thank you for supporting the school's COVID-19 testing programme. We very much look forward to seeing your child back at school next week.

**REMINDER:**

If you're a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of a school student, college student or of a staff member, you can get twice-weekly symptom-free tests.

The symptom-free tests for households are **not available from schools or colleges**. Households can use any testing offered by their employer, or **book** an appointment online at a symptom-free testing site, or **collect** a home-testing kit from a designated collection point, or if unable to travel to a site, **order** a kit online. 
