Headteacher's Message

I hope that this four day week has been a good one for all – a sooner than usual arrival at Friday! This week, I have three important themes for this introduction – the first is an overview of the leaver's events for our Year 11 and 13 cohorts and the second is a really important update for ALL parents/carers on the dangerous and rising number of 'edibles' being consumed across Surrey. The last is a plea.

A reminder that our **Year 11 and Year 13 students** will be on study leave throughout the **assessment period from 10 – 21 May**. They will be registered in exam venues when they are on the school site. All exam year students are particularly asked to wear a warm jumper for their exams—for our Year 11s, the jumper should be worn under their blazers and all other uniform should be worn. Individual student timetables have all been sent home—please can we ask parents/carers to ensure that students have a printed copy and take particular note of the exam venue and seat row and number.

For the last week of this half term, **24 – 28 May**, **Year 11 students** will participate in a 'Next Steps' week, to prepare them for the summer and the next phase of their educational journey. This will incorporate the **Leavers' Assembly on Friday**, which will be the **official last day of school** for Year 11 students. **Year 11 will attend school for this event despite the fact that it is an INSET day for the remainder of students.** Shirt signing will take place after the Leavers' Assembly. Sessions for the Next Steps Week have been organised from 9am – 11.30am, students will then be free to go home. Students can wear their own clothes and attendance is compulsory.

Year 13 also have a week of leavers' activities beginning on **Monday 24 May**. In between their activities, a reminder that teachers will organise a last lesson with their Year 13 groups to round off their learning together. Our Year 13 leavers' activities run in the afternoons and include a range of sporting activities, seminars, and doughnut eating sessions! Their **Leavers' Assembly is on Thursday 27 May at 2pm** in Raynham Hall and is followed by a farewell social on the school field. Mr Robinson provides more information in the Year 13 section that follows.

My second theme is an important one to update you on a worrying and developing Surrey wide situation regarding 'edibles'. Edibles are food products that may contain cannabis. There are many forms of edibles, including sweets, gummies and lollipops. They usually contain – or are marketed as containing – a number of chemicals, many of which are harmful and controlled under the Misuse of Drugs Act (1971) including tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). THC is illegal in the UK. The sweet versions are widely available on the internet and via social media and may be easily accessed by young people. The packaging is often deliberately targeted to attract young people.

The amount of cannabis in these products can vary greatly and sometimes other harmful drugs are added too. The effects of consuming edibles are unpredictable and it can be very easy to accidentally take a larger dose. Edibles take between 1-3 hours to have an effect because food is absorbed into the bloodstream through the liver. Because it takes longer, the person taking them may end up consuming larger amounts of the drug while thinking the drug isn't working. As edibles may look like other products, there is also the risk someone may ingest them without realising they contain drugs—this could include other children in the home. Displayed side effects may include: paranoia, panic attacks, nausea, impaired mobility, hyperactivity, elevated heart rate, hallucinations.

Our children are in danger if they consume these products. If a child presents with any of the above symptoms then you should call 999. If you are made aware of any social media accounts advertising these items, we ask that you report this information to the police or Crime Stoppers. Alternatively, please let the school know and we can support with the reporting process.

So that you can be on the lookout, below is an image of the sorts of packaging used for 'edibles'. My strong hope is that together we can support our young people with information and education and in developing sound judgement to ensure they stay safe.

Lastly, this Bulletin sees me offering up a heartfelt plea. Our current PTA members have done the most extraordinary job of raising funds for our school over a very significant number of years. Their contribution to our children's education has made a very direct and tangible difference to our young people's time at George Abbot. Our current PTA committee feel that the time is right for them to hand over this work to a new set of parents to take the organisation into the next phase of its work in support of our students and our school community. This means that we are looking for a core of parents to be the holders of the PTA torch for the next chapter. All administrative processes are in place and there is a school staff member who works in support of the committee, the accounts are in very good order and the foundations are in place for a new set of ideas and initiatives. This has been a difficult decision for the committee and I know how much it will mean to them to be able to leave their work in safe hands. ⇒ Extra time evidence in exams (Year 10, 11, 12 &13)

If your son/daughter has extra time as an exam access arrangement, it is important they provide Ms Barratt (Exams Access Arrangements Lead) with copies of their work where they have used their extra time. They must provide one copy per subject. Ideally exam situation evidence is best, but it can also be class based assessments, school work finished off at home or even homework that takes longer than the prescribed time to complete—if it is correctly evidenced. If your son/daughter brings the work to Ms Barratt in USIC, she can copy and file it in their student record.

Year 12 students should take the opportunity of the upcoming mock exams to provide this evidence. Without this—we are not able to apply for extra time for them in the Sixth Form.

The Matrix Trust has opened a new youth café at their premises in Allen House Grounds in the heart of Guildford.

What is the Hideaway?

The Hideaway is a social enterprise café. During the day it will serve the general public and after school it will open as The Hideaway Youth Café, exclusively for young people.

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Year 13	<p>Student Assessment Information</p> <p>As indicated in our previous comms regarding the final grade process for Year 13, we are releasing a report for every student which clearly lays out their marks in the assessments that will be contributing to the final grade process. You can access your child's report via the SIMs App. They will be uploaded today, however they may take up to 24 hours to show on the app.</p> <p>To make the report clear and simple, each subject has an assessment summary which states specifically which assessments will contribute to the final grade. Due to the range of evidence being used across all of the subjects, the table has been simplified to group together similar sources of evidence. For subjects such as Art the final grade will be based solely on the NEA; as the marking process is not complete there are no marks shown at this stage. Where subjects do have an NEA as part of the evidence the mark will only be shown if the moderation and marking process is complete.
