Headteacher's Message

15 October 2021

All

As we approach half term, I write to seek your support. I have taken the decision to bookend half term with **two weeks of mask wearing for all students and staff in corridors, lunch queue and internal venues where large numbers of people gather**—such as wet break venues, the Sixth Form Common Room at break times and the Atrium at break times. This is to support all our families as we approach half term by reducing the chances of COVID-19 cases rising over this period.

This George Abbot circuit break measure will apply from **Monday 18 October to Friday 5 November inclusive**. As ever, the measures are not compulsory but are strongly recommended. We ask for your support to ensure a good healthy break for all over half term and a healthy return to the Autumn Term part ii.

Therefore, all students and staff are asked to ensure that they have a mask with them at school daily, that they put their mask on as they leave every lesson and whenever they re-enter the corridors after break-time outside. Staff and students should have a sealable bag to contain their mask and ensure they have sufficient supplies of hand sanitiser and tissues should they be needed. Mask wearing will not be necessary in classrooms at this stage.

Additionally, next week, we will send home another box of lateral flow tests for students. Please ensure students complete a test before they return to school on Monday 1 November. Please note, these are new tests and are slightly different in that they involve a NASAL SWAB ONLY (there is no requirement to swab the throat). The tests also need a different developing time. Please read the instructions carefully before carrying out the test to ensure you receive an accurate result. For instructions, please see the link below:



<p><b>Year 11</b></p>	<p>⇒ <b>Early Internal Examinations</b></p> <p>Year 11s will be sitting early formal internal examinations in Maths F/H Paper 1 and English Literature Paper 1, ahead of the formal internal examinations that will take place in December.</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> Students will sit Maths Paper 1 F/H Non Calculator on <b>Friday 19 November at 1:55pm</b>. Students must have a ruler graduated in centimetres and millimetres, protractor, pair of compasses, pen, HB pencil and eraser. Students should liaise with their teachers who can advise where they can find questions to help with revision. Students will need to revise everything they have been taught from the start of Year 9.</p> <p><b>English:</b> On <b>Monday 22 November at 8:30am</b> students will sit a formal internal examination for English Literature. In light of the recent changes to exams guidance from AQA, this will enable students to familiarise themselves with the new format of the literature papers. Students will sit Paper 1N - The 19th Century Novel: A Christmas Carol, and Paper 1M - Modern Texts: An Inspector Calls. Teachers will make revision resources available on the Student Learning Environment and Satchel One.</p> <p>Additionally, AQA has made the decision to reduce the required subject content from the GCSE English Literature specification, in light of the disruption to schooling over the past academic year. As a result, students will no longer be examined on the Love and Relationships Anthology Poetry, so there is no requirement for students to revise these poems for their internal examinations. Instead, the December English Literature internal exam paper will cover Shakespeare: Macbeth, and Unseen Poetry. The GCSE English Language papers are unaffected and will go ahead in their current format. More details on the December internal examinations will be made available over the coming weeks.</p>

## Focus on—Black History Month

Having learnt about the reasons for the outbreak of the First World War, how it turned into stalemate and why the British government introduced conscription in 1916, our Year 9 students are learning about the contribution of non-white soldiers to the conflict. We will explore how and why troops from British colonies were asked to fight for the Empire, and how far their experiences differed from white Europeans on the Western Front. We will be uncovering the rarely-told stories of Black soldiers during the East Africa campaign and what happened to the British West Indies Regiment. This enquiry will finish with reflection on why this aspect of the First World War is so rarely focused upon, and consider the recent controversy over the lack of memorialisation of African troops. Additionally, a great display of books supporting Black History Month can be found in the Gallery and USIC for students to enjoy.


