<p><b>Feedback</b> <i>How students improve and progress</i></p> <p>(This section will be linked to SIMS reports)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How will students receive feedback in your subject? Frequency and form? (As a principle, students should receive formal feedback once per half term) With each topic students complete a topic booklet, knowledge test and at least one essay one essay; these are marked and feedback is given. Roughly two topics are covered each half term.</li> <li>• How can parents help students? Where can parents access feedback? Parents can access marks in the students' files and on SIMS; information on the specification etc is available on SMH and on the school website. Parents can encourage students to follow political developments in the news, attend lessons and complete homework. In addition, parents can help with revision for example testing students on key terms and knowledge-based ideas. Parents should also attend parents' evenings and clinics.</li> <li>• How will you ensure parents and students understand the next steps to enable progress? Students are aware of the steps they need to take to make progress from regular feedback on work and during discussions. Data drops, parents' evenings and exam clinics are useful for informing parents on the steps students need to take. In addition, parents may be contacted if there are particular issues with student progress.</li> <li>• How can parents support at home? See above.</li> </ul>
