Frequency and form? Verbal feedback every lesson. Written / exam assessment feedback at least once per half term. 2. How can parents help students? Where can parents access feedback? Lesson resources, key information on the units and how to answer the exam questions are on the SLE. Written feedback can be found in student folders. 3. How will you ensure parents and students understand the next steps to enable progress? Verbal confirmation and articulation of actions required during the lesson. Take time to talk to students individually when needed. Contact home when necessary. Talk about the next steps at consultation appointments, using the students to explain themselves what progress they need to take, and why. 4. How can parents support at home? The most important thing parents can do is to be inquisitive about the pupils learning in sociology. To talk about their learning and discuss current events, encouraging reflection and a critical analysis on what has been learnt in the classroom, Teachers and pupils are proud of the curriculum we deliver and a keen interest from home really helps. Parents can assist by checking that pupils work is organised effectively, deadlines are met and that students are aware of upcoming assessments. Where parents have any questions about a pupil's progress, including how they can best push themselves further, they should not hesitate to contact their child's classroom teacher.
