As we continue to see and hear and read about the ongoing crisis in Ukraine, we want to do something. We have partnered with a parent from George Abbot, to organise donations. We are calling on all parents/carers to help us make a difference by donating items from the list below. Thank you so much to our PTA for coordinating this important community effort.

Donations urgently needed

- Long lasting food (canned, pasta, rice, etc.)
- Warm clothes in good condition (adults and children)
- Blankets, bed linen, sleeping bags
- Nappies
- Wipes, toiletries, sanitary products
- First aid kits, bandages, dressings

Any surplus donations will be used to support other families in need in our George Abbot community.

Secondly, we would like to emphasise the long list of charities who are needing financial donations. If you can would like to make a financial donation, the organisations collecting funds for Ukraine include:

- The British Red Cross, which has launched an appeal to help the Ukrainian Red Cross to provide food, medicine, clothing and shelter, as well as first aid training in bomb shelters and, in the last few days, 15,000 litres of drinking water to villages in eastern Ukraine.
- The UNHCR refugee agency, which is funding emergency shelters, repairs for homes damaged by shelling, emergency cash assistance, psychological support and warm clothing.
- Unicef, the UN's children's charity, which is helping to ensure families have clean water and food and that child health and protection services continue.
- Save the Children, which is providing cash assistance, food and other support to refugees crossing into Romanian and Lithuania, as well as in Ukraine itself.

⇒ Statement of Entries - Summer 2022 Exam Series

George Abbot has now submitted exam entries for students sitting examinations this summer to the exam boards. As a result of this we need to provide students with their Statements of Entry to inform them of the entries we have made on their behalf. These will be distributed as follows:

- Year 13 - Breaks 1 & 2 on Wednesday 9 March and Thursday 10 March - Sixth Form Reception area
- Year 10 - Friday 11 March during form time
- Year 11 - Monday 14 March during form time

⇒ Health related Behaviour Surveys

Our school, along with several others, has agreed to participate in a very important Health Behaviour Survey amongst young people. We have been asked to support the work of the Local Authority Children's Services and Public Health and we stand to benefit substantially through our participation in the survey. The survey will be carried out before the end of the Spring Term by students in years 8 and 10. Students will complete the questionnaire in ICT rooms during PSHE lesson time.

The questions concern a wide range of health behaviours, for example: home and family relationships, emotional health and well-being, tobacco, alcohol, leisure and money, healthy eating, exercise, drugs and sexual health. Each questionnaire is anonymous and confidential, and no student will be identified when the data is returned to George Abbot, the Local Authority will receive only the summary of all schools data, in which individual schools are not identified.

Focus on: SATRO Event

On Saturday 26 February, a group of Year 11 students, Ethan G, James T and Joel V, travelled to Harrogate to take part in the First Lego League England and Wales National Finals, after they qualified for the finals, by winning the Portsmouth regional event.

The students were competing against 64 other teams from all over England and Wales who had won their respective regional heats. During the day, teams were taking part in various activities, the main ones being the Robot Tournament and the Innovation Project presentations, both of these were extensions of the same elements from the regional heats.

In addition to the two main elements, there were fun activities such as a Lego Graffiti Wall, an interactive word search, team photos and a Lego building competition. Furthermore, there were various STEM opportunities to get involved with including an F1 paper car challenge and various other stalls to keep the students entertained throughout the day.

In their robot runs, the team scored 140, 160 and 205, which showed improvement each run, but was not enough this time to make it to the knockout rounds, but the team worked extremely hard and were courteous and sportsmanlike throughout.

During the Innovation Project presentation, the team were professional, and articulate with the judges and gave a fantastic presentation and also gave a confident and technical presentation of their robot design and design process.

Unfortunately, the students were unable to achieve any awards on the day for all their hard work in preparing for the final, but they had a fantastic day and enjoyed all the different activities and in all aspects they performed with maturity, dignity, sportsmanship and were a credit to themselves and the school.

After competing in the competition for the last five years since Year 7, in that time they have collected two regional awards for their innovation projects, one for the robot element and one Regional Winners award, the achievement of reaching the National Finals, was a huge accolade and accomplishment that they can be very proud of and remember for years to come.

A big thank you also goes to Mr Hunter for supporting students at this event.
