The summer term is now in full swing. Bright days have been matched by cold temperatures, but mercifully, a dry field. Students have relished the freedom of green spaces and it is a joy to see them running, enjoying the football goals and rugby posts as well as sitting and chatting with friends in a favourite sunny spot.

You may be aware that for many years, we have had a unit for students with visual impairment at George Abbot. However, unit student numbers have declined over recent years and from September, our unit is not anticipated to have any students. We have therefore launched a consultation to close the VI Unit at George Abbot School, from 1 September 2022.

Surrey data regarding student numbers over the coming years indicates that there is insufficient demand for VI places in this area and the unit is, therefore, unsustainable. Please be assured that this consultation does not signal any change in our inclusive ethos or result in any redundancies. I hope you know and see that the diversity of our school is extremely important to our ethos.

The full rationale for this change of provision is documented in the attached proposal, with supporting evidence from Surrey County Council. We would like to know what you think about the proposal to remove the Visual Impairment Unit (owing to a lack of demand) at George Abbot School, from 1 September 2022. All feedback must be received by 12 noon on Thursday 26 May 2022. The outcome of this consultation will be communicated to you all through the George Abbot bulletin, posted on our school website, as well as the trust website.

Next, some updated guidance in relation to COVID-19. UKHSA guidance sets out that children and adults with symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as COVID-19, and who have a high temperature or do not feel well, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with others until they no longer have a temperature and feel well. This is therefore the guidance we are working to at George Abbot. Examination season now approaches with certainty: during the exam season any illness is of course a concern. This year, external exams have all been planned so that there is at least a 10 day gap between papers of the same subject. If a student is unwell and has to miss a paper there is a self-certification process that has to then be signed off by George Abbot staff as part of tight controls in this area. All students sitting external exams this summer will receive details of their seating arrangements from our Examinations Officer next week.

Next week also sees District Sports for 120 of our athletes across year groups - very well done to all those students who have been selected to represent George Abbot and Good Luck! Today, we say two goodbyes and two adieus to four staff: Mrs Howard who works in our SEN staff team and Mrs Corcoran who is our Attendance Officer are off to challenges new - we wish them both well and thank them sincerely, for all of their work with our students. They have both been staff of star quality. We also say adieu to Mrs Wrazen who begins her maternity leave and to Mrs Evans-Dix who begins her adoption leave - such exciting times for them both. We shall think of them warmly until their return.
