
### ⇒ Year 10 English Literature

After half term, Year 10 students will be studying **either** Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol **or** Robert Louis Stevenson's Dr Jekyll & Mr Hyde as part of their GCSE English Literature course. It is essential that students own a copy of the text so that they can highlight and make annotations throughout, whilst it is being studied in class. This will be very beneficial when they come to revise the text again in Year 11.



Students in receipt of Pupil Premium will receive their text and guide free of charge. If a student already has their own copy then this too will be acceptable.





### ⇒ Maths Exam

The Year 9 summer Maths exam will take place in Maths lessons on Tuesday 21 June.

Students must have a ruler graduated in centimetres and millimetres, protractor, pair of compasses, pen, HB pencil and eraser, some classes will also need a calculator.

Please encourage your child to look at SatchelOne and speak to their teacher who can advise where practice can be found to aid revision and the topics that will be covered.

The science Heads of Department will send out further information to all Year 9 students in due course, via show my homework (SatchelOne).</p> <p>This exam, together with the science exam that Year 9 students took earlier this year, will be used to decide on setting for Year 10, and to decide who is offered a place on the treble science GCSE course.</p>


