We believe that George Abbot Sixth Form is the place to realise a young person's true potential.



It is recognised by Universities as excellent preparation for writing a dissertation and therefore some Universities will reduce the grades required for entry if students have completed this qualification. Students must also complete the Advanced Study Skills & Critical Analysis course if wishing to complete the EPQ.</p>			
Practical Options	<p>Sports Leaders Award Provides additional skills and experience for those wanting to deliver sport. The course also includes a detailed understanding and delivery of sports leadership, leading sessions to improve fitness and experience of planning and delivering a sporting event. Please note this option does involve an application process.</p>		<p>Duke of Edinburgh Award Duke of Edinburgh Awards are the leading youth achievement award in the country. The awards allow students to push personal boundaries, gain new skills and enhance their CVs and University applications. We offer the opportunity to work towards the achievement of the Silver and Gold Awards in the Sixth Form. Please note this option does involve an application process.</p>			
Additional Options	<p>Peer Mentoring Supporting students in younger year groups with emotional, social or behavioural issues. Support and development

Promoting well-being and personal growth

Pastoral Care

High quality pastoral care is at the heart of what we do at George Abbot. The Sixth Form's Pastoral Team oversee the academic and pastoral progress of every student and offer additional leadership to the team of Personal Tutors. Each year group has its own dedicated Head of Year who has responsibility for the welfare and safety of each student, along with our Sixth Form Safeguarding Lead. Students with more complex pastoral needs are additionally supported by our Youth Worker, Counselling team and our SEND team.

Personal Tutors

Each student will be assigned a Personal Tutor. The primary role of the tutor is to build positive relationships and they are the students' first point of contact for their welfare and progress. They also play an important role in guiding students towards their next steps beyond the Sixth Form and play a crucial role in providing insightful references through their close relationship with the students. Students will have morning whole group tutorial sessions with their tutor as well as regular one to one meetings to set targets and monitor progress and well-being.

Student Leadership

We believe Student Voice to be a crucial part of how we shape our community. Listening to students and valuing their contributions is an intrinsic part of how we organise and monitor our school. We have a variety of opportunities through which students can play a leading role in gathering Student Voice and shaping our community. We have a Student Leadership Team in both Year 12 and 13 that includes Head Students, Student Representatives, House Representatives for the different Houses in our house system and also Subject Representatives. Students in these roles actively engage in organising and supporting a huge number of key events and initiatives to continue to improve the experience we offer.

Financial Support

George Abbot students have the opportunity to be guided by us through the application for the 16-19 bursary scheme. Students can gain support, through this scheme, for travel, food costs and also to assist with one off costs for educational activities and expenses.

Careers Education Information & Guidance ('CEIG')

CEIG is a partnership between students, their parents or carers and the school. CEIG supports students on their journey whether they are preparing for further or higher education, apprenticeships, training or employment.

Specialist Team of Staff

We are fortunate to have 4 additional members of staff within the Sixth Form team whose role is focussed on providing outstanding pastoral support and guidance for students.

Specialist Support for Oxbridge students

We have an excellent track record in preparing students to study at Oxford or Cambridge. We offer a programme of support that includes a visit to Oxbridge Conference at Epsom Racecourse, STEP qualification preparation for Maths, mock interviews, alumni visits, specialist admissions tests and supported applications to Summer Schools. This is in addition to the challenge and enrichment from within each academic subject.

Higher Education and Alternative Pathways Guidance

Students receive a variety of talks and seminars throughout the year giving guidance on higher education routes and other pathways such as GAP years, apprenticeships and employment. They also have the opportunity to book appointments throughout the year with our higher education advisor or external careers advisor to help support their decisions.

They attend the UCAS Higher Education conference and Apprenticeship Roadshow in March and engage in a week-long Next Steps event. The week includes a visit to a choice of Universities, workshops on UCAS applications and personal statements, student finance and apprenticeships. This event also includes the opportunity to select and attend a variety of seminars led by over 30 different George Abbot Alumni who have gone on to achieve great success. In these seminars, they will share that valuable hands-on experience directly with our students.

Work Related Learning

All students are encouraged to engage in a week-long work experience in the Summer Term of Year 12. Students will be guided by our own Work Experience Coordinator to get the best possible work related learning. We believe this is a crucial part of preparing students for next steps alongside providing extremely valuable evidence for a university or employment application.

Our Graduation Programme

- 1 Graduation Award**
Achievement of a minimum of three A Levels and/or BTEC qualifications.
- 2 Graduation *with honours***
The student is recognised for their academic perseverance and the excellent contribution they have made to the George Abbot community.
- 3 Graduation *with highest distinction***
The student has gone above and beyond to improve the school and wider community. A truly unique award.

Graduation Ceremony

Every year we hold a Year 13 graduation ceremony which is an important conclusion for our sixth formers' education and personal journey at George Abbot school. Here we recognise not only their academic achievements but also how they contributed to the whole school and wider community. Students receive a graduation certificate which can be presented to potential employers or university admission tutors.
