
Strep A/Scarlet Fever Reminders

As you may be aware, there has been a national increase in Scarlet fever cases, which is also a common, and usually a mild illness caused by bacteria called Group A Strep (GAS). GAS is a common bacteria and lots of us carry it in our throats and on our skin and it doesn't always result in illness. However, GAS can cause a number of infections, some mild and some more serious, such as strep throat, impetigo and scarlet fever.

Contact NHS 111 or your GP if you suspect your child has scarlet fever, because early treatment of scarlet fever with antibiotics is important to reduce the risk of complications. If your child has scarlet fever, keep them at home until at least 24 hours after the start of antibiotic treatment to avoid spreading the infection to others. Warning: Disposable Vapes

Disposable vapes are small, low-cost flavoured e-cigarettes that are child appealing with a variety of sweet flavours and colours. These devices are widely available in shops, online and via social media. They are VERY dangerous.

Key messages:

- Talk to your children about vaping. Treat vaping situations (such as vape shops or advertisements) as learning opportunities to ask them what they know, what they think, and how they feel.
- Explain that vaping is potentially less harmful than smoking, but only for smokers who want to quit.
- Vaping is not for non-smokers, especially children and young people.
- Explain that some vapes contain nicotine and that nicotine is a highly addictive substance which is very hard to stop once you've started.
- Explain that the vapour made from e-cigarettes is not made of water. The vapour contains harmful chemicals and very fine particles of oil that are inhaled into the lungs. These particles can block the lungs leading to breathing problems, lung cancer and sometimes death.
- Vaping can also have an adverse effect on their physical activity and sports, and their overall health and wellness. Explain that putting weird unknown chemicals into your body at this stage is even worse than it is for adults, because they're still developing

⇒ **Early School Closure for Year 10 Parent Subject Consultations—Tuesday 10 January 2023**

School will be closing at 1.30pm on Tuesday 10 January 2023 for the Year 8 Parent Subject consultation meetings.

When the Progress Monitoring Subject Consultations are for a year group other than their own, students are expected to complete work set independently at home during the afternoon. This work will be set via Satchel One and/or the SLE.

Provision has been made for students who are unable to go home at this time. If you wish for your son/daughter to remain supervised in school, please let us know by emailing curriculum@georgeabbot.surrey.sch.uk by close of school on **Monday 9 January**. It is vital that we are forewarned of those who will be in attendance.

If you notify us your child will be remaining in school and your arrangements change, it is essential you let us know of the change before 12.00pm on the day. Where we have been notified that a student will be remaining in school, if they fail to arrive and register at USIC, you will be contacted by a truancy call alert from our attendance system. Therefore, it is important they register in USIC at 2.15pm if you have notified us that your son/daughter is remaining in school.

Please be reminded school buses will run at the usual time.

⇒ **Reporting your child's absence**

Please ensure you report your child's absence from school **by 9.00am** by either calling 01483 888000 and selecting option 1, or email absence@georgeabbot.surrey.sch.uk. Please include form group and reason for absence. Failure to do this will result in a text message being sent by our texting system which alerts parents/carers that their child has not registered. We need to be advised each day of your child's absence.

The texts and emails are sent between 10.00am to 11.00am, once all the messages and emails have been inputted onto SIMS. Parents/carers are then required to respond to these messages providing a reason for the absence. Unexplained absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

⇒ **Advance Warning: London Road, Burpham roadworks starting January 2023**

SCC is commencing an Active Travel scheme along the London Road between January and August 2023.

Road works and changes will happen in between the Woodruff avenue roundabout and Boxgrove Road roundabout (Phase 1) and Woodruff Avenue roundabout and New Inn Lane Roundabout (Phase 2). This includes making London Road a one way system during the works.

⇒ Internal Assessments

Thank you for your ongoing support for these important formal assessments. These are vital in forming the basis for student's predicted grades for Sixth Form and college applications, providing evidence for tier changes, and also in preparing our students for the GCSE process in the summer. Therefore, please can we ask you to ensure your child:

- Arrives at school in good time - on site by 8.15am every day from Monday 12 December to Friday 16 December.
- Is 'road safe' when waiting outside Elmslie Hall as staff traffic comes on to site through Elmslie Gate - students should NOT wait on the service road.
- Has the correct equipment needed for each paper e.g. scientific calculators for science exams
- Understands that they are under formal exam conditions and there must be no communication, including non-verbal, in the exam venue.

Focus on: Good News Stories!



A massive well done to all the students involved in the Christmas Concerts showcased last week. Two amazing performances at the end of a busy term. A big thank you to all the parents/carers who came to support and to the Performing Arts Faculty for organising.

On Wednesday 23 November and Thursday 24 November the English Department took 180 students from Years 11 and 10 to see J B Priestley's 'An Inspector Calls' at the Yvonne Arnaud Theatre in Guildford. This was an excellent enrichment opportunity for students who have already studied the GCSE text as part of their GCSE Literature course and for Year 10 students who will be studying the text next year. It was an excellent and captivating performance with a talented cast and imaginative set. Below is a review from a group of year 11 students:



"Wow! What a night. After a hiatus from the theatre, we were pleasantly surprised by the sheer quality of the production. First of all, the actors were fantastic. The acting was full of charisma and passion, with all them embracing their roles; it really brought J.B. Priestley's ideals and story to life. When the curtain opened, the set was intricate: rain that set the mood, a house that reflected the ideas of the class divide and a glimpse of their society unknown to us in the book. The acting felt like it was being directed towards us, as if we were a 1940s audience. We found the casting of the Inspector very apt – it seemed just as Priestley had intended. He was a dominating and intimidating figure on stage, standing up for Eva Smith's working class roots. At the climax of the play, the set mirrored the feelings of the family, with an extravagant display of catastrophe, with the house literally crashing and burning, as the family did. It definitely came as a fitting shock to all in the audience. Strong emotions were felt by all at key moments in the play, accompanied by the audiences' cheers and applause. The engagement by all goes to show just how well this play was executed. This was a night to remember and helped with studies of the play as well! Sustainable GA

The Sustainable GA process continues despite the cold weather!

As part of our vision to make George Abbot School a more sustainable place and community, we have become a 'Wilder School' working with Surrey Wildlife Trust on improving biodiversity in our school grounds and fostering outdoor learning. Year 9 students welcomed Surrey Wildlife Trust to their assembly in September, which gave them insight into what they can do in and out of school to help wildlife flourish in our County.

Every Year 9 student took part in either planting trees, hedgerow plants or clearing and developing our outdoor learning area over the last two weeks. This experience helped to support topics being studied in Geography and Biology as well as giving our students an opportunity to work outdoors and feel like a valued part of our sustainability journey.

In addition, our sustainability leaders from Years 7, 8 and 9, supported by Surrey Wildlife Trust, have been involved in a grounds review this week identifying habitat features which could be added to the school, developing visions for nature.

The Year 9s organised a plant based bake sale this week which raised over £150 the Year 8s are planning an outdoor recycling project to be launched in the New Year. We are grateful for their time and energy, and love their ideas.
