## Headteacher's Message

6 January 2023

All,

A very Happy New Year - 2023 is underway! It has been a joy to see rested students return to school, marginally moody about early morning get ups, but actually pleased to see their friends and possibly the odd member of staff, too, getting back into the routine of the school year. This half term is infamously brief - just five weeks. Yet, it is a really key one in the educational cycle. As teachers, we have spent our INSET days revisiting the principles of great teaching, with a clear focus on the most important concepts, knowledge and skills for each of our subjects. We have considered the necessity of the elimination of distraction in our lessons and discussed the specific issue of transitioning between phases of the lesson with clear instruction and logical flow. We know that happy schools are based on positive relationships and it is essential that every one of our students feels valued in and connected to their school. Teaching is a complex thing and we never stop learning how to do it better.

For students across the school, learning is everything - that is why they are here. Year 13 are immersed in their mock exams and, I hope, have given them the preparation they are due. Year 13 mock results will be published to parents/carers on Tuesday 31 January. Year 11 are anticipating their mock exam results, perhaps with some apprehension in some cases; reports are published to parents/carers on Friday 20 January. As Year 11 parents/carers, do encourage your child to make a list of all of the topics they found more challenging in this set of mocks and focus the next phase of their revision right there. Year 10 RE mock results were published at the end of last term - Year 10 parents/carers can very usefully check that your child has access to all of the relevant study material and help your child to plan a revision schedule that starts now - it is invaluable experience in preparing for Year 11. Year 9 have formal examinations in the week of 30 January - these will take place in Maths, English, Science, History, Geography, RE and MFL. They will be taken in the hall as important practice for the years ahead. Likewise, Year 8 have their formal examination week for Maths, English and Science beginning the following week, on 6 February. Year 7 formal exams are scheduled for the first week after half term - the week of 20 February and will also be in Maths, English and Science. If you are a Year 7 parent/carer, now is a good time to have a look at your child's books from the Autumn term. How organised are they? Do they need a major burst of worksheet sticking-in? They too, should start revising now - a gentle build up will prevent a panicked half term.

Amidst this activity, we also have three Parent Subject Meetings:

- Tuesday 10 January - Year 10 - with school closure at 1.35pm.
- Wednesday 25 January - Year 11 - with school closure at 1.35pm.
- Thursday 2 February - Year 13 - these do not begin until after school and so no early closure on this day.

Lastly, for Year 11 and Year 9, we have Next Steps interviews taking place for every student. The senior staff at school including my SLT, our Heads of Faculty and some of our pastoral team will be conducting 1:1 interviews with every student in Year 9 and 11 to discuss their options for the two years ahead - GCSEs for Year 9 and A Levels or BTECs for our Year 11s. Do keep this on your radar and try to extricate information about when this is happening for your child from them! In advance they should:

- Think about the subjects they flourish in.
- Think about areas they might want to zone in on for the future.
- Be able to talk about themselves, their interests and their dreams.
- Remember when their appointment is, where it is and be on time.

Dreams matter - we all need a sense of the road ahead, something to aspire to, a secret ambition - our students can do whatever they decide to work for. This half term is about serious hard work, focus and ambition.

### ⇒ Chain Letters

We have been made aware that there might be a chain letter in circulation, via social media received by a number of local children. A chain letter is a message that encourages the reader to send it on to a number of new recipients. The content is often upsetting, deceptive or threatening and sometimes uses superstition, hoax or coercion to encourage participation. If your child receives a chain letter please ask them to show it, immediately, to a trusted adult. Reassure them that neither they nor their family/friends will come to any harm as a result of their non-engagement. If you feel that the content is such that it warrants a referral to the police or Children's Services then please do so using the following numbers:

The role requires being in the exam rooms to help students who may need 'Readers' to read for them, or 'Scribes' to help with writing down answers. A clear but quiet speaking voice is necessary for the 'Reader' role. Legible handwriting is necessary for the less common 'Scribing' role.

For those who might be nervous about taking on these vital roles, it is important to say that Volunteers are always accompanied in exam rooms by Lead Invigilators, who are there to answer any queries and provide support at all times.

## Top Tips for supporting your child with Reading

One of the best things you can do in KS3 is to encourage your child to read for pleasure. Reading habits that were established in primary school should not be stopped once they start Year 7. Research shows that children who enjoy reading do significantly better at school; parents/carers play an important role in helping to develop a love of reading. Some top tips:

- Let them choose what they want to read, rather than choosing what you think they should read.
- Encourage your child to read magazines, comics, blogs and websites as well as books.
- Talk to your child about books you have read that you haven't enjoyed, as well as ones you've loved.
- Make time to read together if you can – 10 minutes a few times a week will make a big difference.
- Talk about what they are watching on TV/film and see if there are any book tie-ins.
- Join the local library and let them choose some audio books; listen to the audio books in the car.
- Buy books, book vouchers or a magazine as presents/rewards.
- Find out what they are studying in their different subjects and look through websites, magazines or non-fiction books relating to their topics.
- Read yourself – set time aside at the weekend for everyone to down tools and read for 20 minutes.
